NEWS FROM INTERLIBRARY LOAN

During the last fiscal year the Interlibrary Loan office provided 7,500+ items (photocopies or books) from our collection to libraries around the world. Materials were sent to libraries in 46 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and Guam. Foreign library recipients included those in eight Canadian provinces, Australia, Switzerland, Hong Kong, and the West Indies. For 7,300+ documents requested by our users we went to libraries in 49 states, the District of Columbia and Canada. The staff in the Interlibrary Loan office, Joel Muranelli, Jackie Pagan, and Michael La Pietra deserve our kudos for a job well done!

FROM THE ARCHIVES

During the past few months, the Archives has provided photographs to the National Library of Medicine for two new projects.
